Please follow all instructions when entering. If you are staying for the weekend, you will be given a yellow (for cubs) ticket to display on your dash. If you are only dropping off your youth, you will be given a white ticket to display. As Beavers and Scouts are also camping with us this weekend, we expect arriving/departing to be a little hectic, please follow all instructions, we would not want any of our youth being harmed in any way.

You may begin to arrive at camp on Friday starting at 5:30 pm. There is a pavilion on site where headquarters will be located for the weekend. Please register as soon as possible to avoid everyone trying to register when we are having our leaders meeting. There is potable water on site, so you do not have to bring water with you. Remember, that trailers are not allowed on the grass but if you are transporting your groups equipment in one, we will have a spot for parking them. Also, there are no personal campfires. We will have three sites where fires will be permitted and group campfires are encouraged.

Scouts Canada - South Lake Simcoe Area

All Packs are requested to use the following format in the leading of the Grand Howl.

Grand Howl Procedure:

1. The Leader calls "PACK", and the Cubs freeze.
The Leader calls, loudly, "Pack...Pack...Pack..." and the Cubs respond by yelling a drawn-out "Pack", and running into a Rock Circle around the Leader (i.e. the Leader is in the center of the circle).
2. By joining hands and taking two or more paces outwards, the Cubs form the Parade Circle.
3. If a Totem Pole is to be used, its base should be attached. The Sixer, who is to lead the Grand Howl, brings in the totem and sets it at the Leader's right-hand side. The Sixer returns to his place in the Circle.
4. The Leader faces the Sixer who is to lead the Grand Howl, nods head, and the Sixer raises hands over head, and brings them right down.

NOTE: The Sixer remains in place in the Circle of Cubs and doesn't step into the Circle.

5. The Cubs, taking their lead from the Sixer, then go into the squat position (on their toes, knees wide apart, first and second fingers of each hand close together and touching the ground, with shoulders back and chins up).
6. All together they howl, making each word (but "Best") a long yowl "Ah-kay-la" (three distinct syllables with equal emphasis on each), "We-e-e-ll do-o-o-o o-u-r Best".
7. "Best" is sharp, loud, short and all together, and as it is shouted all the Cubs spring to the alert position with the two fingers of each hand held together and pointed upwards at each side of their forehead. The fingers should look like a wolf's two ears.
8. Then they keep their two hands up while the leading Cub slowly, loudly, and in a commanding tone, call to the Pack: DYB, DYB, DYB DYB (Do Your Best).
There are 4 "Dybs", and they are pronounced more like "Dib" rather than "Deeb".
9. After the fourth "Dyb", the Cubs drops left hand smartly to side, changes the right hand to a salute (with the two fingers spread), squeals "We-e-e-ll" and barks out "DOB, DOB, DOB, DOB" (Do Our Best). The leader returns the

salute.

10. After the fourth "Dob", all drop the right hand to their sides and remain at "Alert" for further instructions.
11. The Assistant Leaders are in a line outside the Circle. They DO NOT SALUTE, but remain at the alert during the Grand Howl.

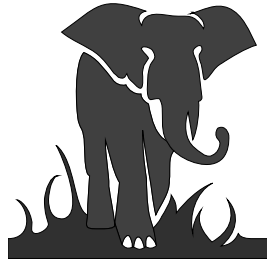

The Hathi Award

This is an annual award earned by one Pack which has carried out the theme in its costumes and campsite, its games/crafts for participation by other Packs, **and** which has a safe and clean campsite.

The Hathi Award is separate from the "A,B,C" Awards for the Grand Howl and Inspections. However, in the event of a tie for the Hathi Award, the points awarded on the Grand Howl and Inspection will be used to ascertain the winner.

There will be one winner of the Hathi Award. There will be two runners-up for the award. The name of the winning Pack will be added to the award.

The judging for the Hathi Award has been broken into four separate sections: Leaders, Cubs, Pack and Campfire/Safety. This should be a fair basis for judging in that the Leaders, the Cubs and the Pack as a whole each have responsibilities at camp. As Leaders, you must provide a safe and clean campsite as well as ensuring that your Cubs are supervised at all times. The Cubs have a responsibility to keep their tents reasonably neat and keep the campsite free from litter and, in general, not behave like animals! The Pack, made up of the Leaders and Cubs, have joint responsibilities in being at events on time, in proper uniform, etc. and **HAVING FUN**. Behavior and participation at campfire are important to the camp as well as safety at all times.

Your campsite will be inspected twice during the weekend by independent judges. The judges will be in Uniform. If there is anyone on site at the time of inspection, the Judges will be required to advise those persons that they are there for the inspection. No inspections will be around mealtimes.
